**RULES OF PUBLICATION ETHICS OF THE PUBLISHING HOUSE OF THE
“REMEMBRANCE AND FUTURE” CENTRE**

The editorial team of the **publishing house of the “Remembrance and Future” Centre** undertakes all efforts to meet the highest ethical standards of the publishing practice and makes use of all resources in order to prevent any authorship abuse and negligence. The editorial team of the **publishing house of the “Remembrance and Future” Centre** fully observes the rules defined below. They are aimed at ensuring propriety, timeliness and integrity of publishing of academic texts and monographs.

The rules of reviewing academic articles and monographs and source papers adopted by the team of the **publishing house of the “Remembrance and Future” Centre** are compliant with the recommendations of the Ministry of Science and Higher Education in Poland related to observing the principles of ethics and good practices in science, whose aim is to ensure integrity of the publishing process and prevention of abuse and negligence on the part of authors and reviewers.

The Antyplagiat System is used for plagiarism check.

If an abuse or negligence is detected on the part of authors or reviewers, the editorial team of the **publishing house of the “Remembrance and Future” Centre** follows the principles of the publishing ethics and adopts procedures specified in the flowcharts of the Committee on Publication Ethics (COPE).

ETHICAL RULES APPLICABLE TO AUTHORS

The decision of the editorial team on acceptance or rejection of a text submitted for publication by the **publishing house of the “Remembrance and Future” Centre** depends solely on the evaluation of its substantive value, originality and message clarity. Articles and monographs can be published once the authors accept the Creative Commons Attribution – Non-Commercial Share Alike 4.0 International Licence or another licence defined in the agreement on transfer of publication copyrights.

Authors are responsible for guaranteeing full originality of submitted texts. No part may constitute plagiarism or contain false or fraudulent data. Authors may not submit for publication texts which were previously published in the same form. Authors must disclose any financial or personal relationships with persons or organisations, who could adversely affect their work. All financing sources or institutions, including R&D institutions, should be indicated. Works submitted for publication shall contain details of all authors, i.e. persons who creatively contributed to the creation of a work, and should not contain details of persons who made no such contribution. All persons indicated must accept that a text is submitted for publication and are held liable for the text. In case of works by more than one author, the lead author is responsible for contacts with the editorial team on behalf of the authors and is obliged to provide all information regarding text related decisions and arrangements to the other authors.
